Introduction to the Wheat Variety Guide

The AWBI Wheat Variety Guide 2008-09 has been developed to provide Australian wheat growers with the opportunity to shape the quality profile of their crop to better reflect market preferences. It will ensure Australian wheat maintains its competitive advantage.

Crop Shaping

The AWBI Wheat Variety Guide 2008-09 summarises information about how current varieties meet the quality requirements of the market.

In 2005, AWB launched its Shaping the Future strategy to cement Australian wheat's position as the world's best, and to stay ahead of the rising competition in the international grain market. Crop Shaping is a set of activities designed to produce a profile (quality, volume and location) of the Australian wheat crop that matches customer requirements.



It is one of the key components of the Shaping the Future strategy. There are twelve basic crop shaping tools available, including wheat breeding, variety classification, receival standards, grower payments including Golden Rewards and Premium Choice Varieties, segregation strategies, regional selection, blending, agronomy packages, direct communication, use of flour additives, mill stream management and new product development. AWBI has real control of only a few of these tools – variety classification, grower payments and setting receival standards. The remaining nine tools, and the effectiveness and impact of all twelve, are dependent on the input of researchers, breeders, growers and customers. Everyone in the Australian wheat-growing industry has the opportunity to directly participate in meeting customer demand and enhance our competitive position.

By working together to create the crop quality required by the market we can collectively maximise growers' profitability. The AWBI Wheat Variety Guide is designed to give you feedback on market quality requirements. We hope that with this information in mind you will, when possible, choose preferred over acceptable varieties, and acceptable over marginal varieties!

Wheat Varieties 2008-09

The AWBI Wheat Variety Guide has been designed to reflect market quality requirements and give growers a better indication of the market impact of different varieties. The Guide is organised according to classification zones. We have included Premium Choice Varieties¹, Popular Varieties² and Recently Released Varieties³ for each zone. The Guide now focuses on the main milling grades and speciality grades only. AWBI has allocated a preference status to varieties, based on export market quality requirements. These preferences are based solely on quality. Please note that due to the uncertainty of future wheat marketing arrangements Premium Choice Variety premiums for the 2008-09 season are not guaranteed

Growers should seek independent advice on the agronomic and disease performance of varieties for their specific production region.

Varieties will be rated as follows:

- Preferred:** Varieties with quality characteristics that best match customer requirements for the grade. These varieties are most likely to enhance pool value (\$/tonne);
- Acceptable:** Varieties with quality characteristics that largely meet customer requirements for the grade. These varieties are likely to have a neutral to positive impact on pool value (\$/tonne); or
- Marginal:** Varieties with quality characteristics that do not adequately or consistently meet customer requirements for the grade. These varieties are likely to have a negative impact on pool value (\$/tonne).

The most important speciality grade in Qld is APDR (durum). APDR is a fledgling grade in Qld and production has been increasing in recent years. Durum is largely consumed in Italy as pasta or in North Africa as couscous. Both of these markets require durum with high yellow colour, high levels of good quality protein and bright, vitreous grains.

Occasionally a variety in a lower grade (eg. ASW) will be amongst the most popular varieties, so we have listed it but not assigned it a preference status.

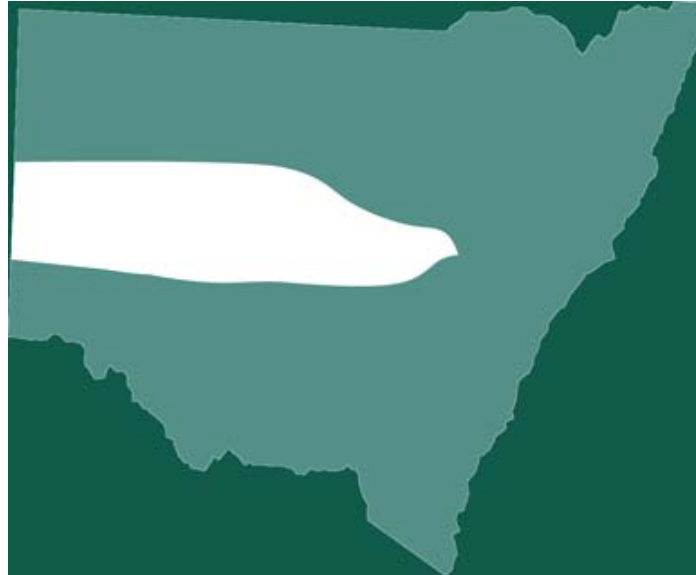

Western Australia

Wheat Varieties 2008-09 Season



Crop shaping priorities in Western Australia

The focus of crop shaping in Western Australia is on the AH and APW milling grades. These grades are largely consumed in white salted and yellow alkaline noodles throughout Asia. Improving milling yield, noodle colour stability and dough strength and extensibility is important to meet the needs of these markets. At the same time flour paste viscosity needs to be improved. Premium Choice Varieties have been selected to address these market requirements.


Important speciality grades in WA are ASWN and ASFT. The udon and white salted noodle markets in Japan and Korea are the primary destinations for ASWN out of WA. Improving noodle colour, colour stability and texture are key quality requirements for maintaining both of these markets. Premium Choice Varieties have been selected to address these market requirements.

ASFT primarily goes to biscuit and cake markets in Asia. These markets require low water absorption and weak, extensible dough properties. Maintaining this performance and improving milling yield are important considerations for the ASFT grade.

When you look at the Selected Wheat Varieties tables, you will notice that the information provided focuses on varieties in the main milling grades and important speciality grades. Occasionally a variety in a lower grade (eg. ASW) will be amongst the most popular varieties, so we have listed it but not assigned it a preference status.
